GENERAL MEETING

APRIL 20, 2023

WELCOME: General meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm at Grace Hill Church meeting room by Vice President Laurie Perez while Betty C. was away. There were approximately 70 people in attendance this evening. Laurie opened the meeting with an introduction of the new microphone system we are testing for possible purchase and replacement of the old one.

There were #3 guests in the audience and introduced as: Carina Pringle from South Africa (visiting her son), Robin S. from Gilroy and a returning former member Ms Acosta. A warm welcome was extended to them by the membership and the Vice President.

EVENING PROGRAM:

Leslie M. of the program committee announced the speaker, Ron Conlon, physical therapist at De Paul Medical Center. The focus of his presentation was tips and information to help quilters prevent injuries and how to keep fit for sewing. He touched on the topics of proper posture, hydration, frequent breaks, setting alarms to alert us to change positions, engaged us in exercises and fielded questions from the audience. He has been in practice for 35 years and the unique 40-minute program was enjoyed by the membership.

The June program will be a Technique night and suggestions for ideas are welcome on the clipboard and sign-ups for helpers/presenters are encouraged. 5-6 presenters are needed to provide an 8–10 minute demonstration on a rotating format during the program time period. There was much anticipation about next year and a sign-up sheet is available for the formation of a new committee which usually begins its preparations in Oct 2023. Theme Ideas were requested and are to be submitted in writing for consideration to the committee.

Quilt Show – September 2023 Leslie M. reporting as a member of the Quilt Show Committee: She invited members to sign up to help the Quilt Show Committee if they are interested. The committee meets the 2nd Friday of the month at the quilt shop at 9:30 am.

The show is Sept 23-24, 2023, and may or may not be in conjunction with Taste of Morgan Hill or the Car Show (which is presumed to still be scheduled on Saturday). Advertising for the Quilt Show will be managed by the guild and ¼ sheet flyers have already been designed and are being passed out along with posters in local businesses.

The Theme is "Through the Needle's Eye" and a challenge for the show has been issued to make any rendition of that theme into a 20' x 20" quilt entry.

Entry blanks will be available on the website and non-members may enter quilts. Other important information will be posted on the guild's website regarding judging, applications and updates.

There will be a section for Vintage Quilts, and it has been requested to have a "story" submitted along with the quilt, telling it's history to the viewer.

There will be a boutique and currently we still need a coordinator for the boutique. Items suggested are pet themed creations, small baby items/quilts, potholders, kitchen items and small decorative items. For those wishing to donate handmade things, Laurie has opened her shop to people wishing to use it for groups to do sewing and crafting for the boutique so give her a call to arrange a date.

There is still a need for a raffle basket coordinator for the show, and this has been a large money maker in years past.
